Each household is sent a sample ballot for the August 24, 2010, Primary Election. You can mark this sample and take it with you to the precinct to use as your guide when marking the OFFICIAL BALLOT that will be issued to you.

Florida law requires photo ID and signature ID at the precinct.

ABSENTEE BALLOT

An Absentee ballot may be requested for a specific election or for all elections in the current calendar year. Only the voter or a member of the voter's immediate family (spouse, child, parent, sibling, or grandparent) may make the request. When requesting an Absentee Ballot, the voter must provide the following information: name, residence address, date of birth, telephone number, and address where the Absentee Ballot is to be mailed. If a member of the voter's immediate family is requesting the ballot, the requester must provide the voter's information listed above as well as the requester's: name, relationship to voter, address, and driver's license number, if available. Absentee Ballots may also be requested by contacting our office at 850-638-6230.

- If your address or name has changed, contact the elections office **BEFORE** Election Day.
- Check your voter information card for the location of your polling place.
- Take your drivers license or another form of photo and signature ID to the polls. (Per Florida statutes, Buyers Club and Employee Badges are no longer acceptable forms of identification for voting.)

MAIL BALLOT INFORMATION

Why stand in line for the same ballot you can have mailed to your home?

- * Any registered voter may vote by mail.
- * A mail ballot is the same as an absentee ballot; however, voters no longer need to be absent from their precinct on election day to vote by mail.
- * To request a mail ballot, please call the elections office at 850-638-6230.
- * All requests for ballots to be mailed must be received no later than six (6) days prior to an election.
- * If you choose to vote by mail, please make sure that your signature on file in the elections office is up-to-date.
- * Voted mail ballots must be returned to the elections office by 7:00 P.M. Election Day. (F.S.101.67(2) and 101.6103(2).)

Please study this ballot before going to vote. This is only a sample of the total ballot for Washington County. Your precinct is designated on your voter information card. Please vote in the Primary Election August 24, 2010.

Voter's Bill of Rights

Each voter in this state has the right to:

1. Vote and have his or her vote accurately counted.
2. Cast a vote if he or she is in line at the official closing of the polls in that county.
3. Ask for and receive assistance in voting.
4. Receive up to two replacement ballots if he or she makes a mistake prior to the ballot being cast.
5. An explanation if his or her registration or identity is in question.
6. If his or her registration or identity is in question, cast a provisional ballot.
7. Written instructions to use when voting, and, upon request, oral instructions in voting from elections officers.
8. Vote free from coercion or intimidation by elections officers or any other person.
9. Vote on a voting system that is in working condition and that will allow votes to be accurately cast.

Voter Responsibilities

Each Registered voter in this state should:

1. Familiarize himself or herself with the candidates and issues.
2. Maintain with the office of the supervisor of elections a current address.
3. Know the location of his or her polling place and its hours of operation.
4. Bring proper identification to the polling station.
5. Familiarize himself or herself with the operation of the voting equipment in his or her precinct.
6. Treat precinct workers with courtesy.
7. Respect the privacy of other voters.
8. Report any problems or violations of election laws to the supervisor of elections.
9. Ask questions, if needed.
10. Make sure that his or her completed ballot is correct before leaving the polling station.

NOTE TO VOTER: Failure to perform any of these responsibilities does not prohibit a voter from voting.
